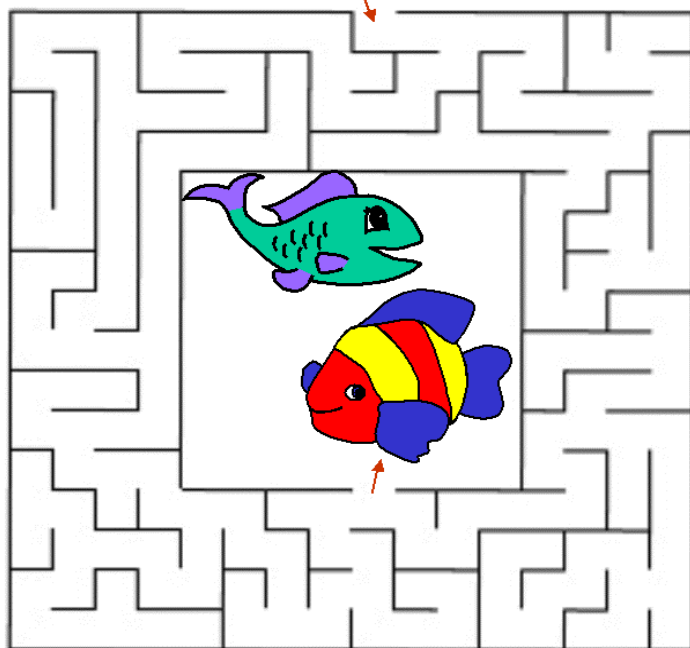

John 8:32 "Ye shall know the truth and the truth shall make you free."

From this passage we draw the conclusion that it is possible for man to come to a knowledge of the truth as revealed in God's word, the truth that will set a man free from the bondage of sin and error (Romans 6:16-17). James tells us in James 1:21, "lay apart all filthiness and naughtiness (wickedness) and receive with meekness the engrafted word which is able to save our souls." All the doctrines, theories and philosophies of man combined will not, yea cannot, set us free or save our souls. They will only result in more bondage and ultimately eternal condemnation (2 John 9; 2 Thessalonians 1:7-9). Drive down the streets of any village, town or city of this country and you will pass by "churches" galore in which all manner of doctrine is being taught, mixed with the theories of men. Folks, only the truth of God's word will set us free or save our soul. Only the truth will purify the soul and make one fit for the heavenly abode. So many vain words are being spoken in the realm of religion today (Ephesians 5:6) that it becomes easy to be caught up and carried away with the doctrines of men that are strange to the truth that sets one free (Ephesians 4:14; Hebrews 13:9; 1 Timothy 4:1-3; 2 Timothy 3:1-7; 2 Timothy 4:1-4). Do not err my friend, in order to be set free, we must hear and obey only the word of God (Romans 10:10-17). Understand this, it is vitally important what we hear and how we hear it (Matthew 17:5; Galatians 1:6-9; Matthew 7:21-23). It is my prayer that all of us will gladly hear God's word (Acts 2:41) and receive with meekness that word which is able to save our souls (James 1:21).

We search for many things in this life but I submit to you that the greatest search we can make is for the truth spoken of by our Lord in John 8:32. Be like the Bereans mentioned in Acts 17:11. Investigate whether or not the things being spoken by your preacher, your Elders, your leaders are according to the truth of the word spoken by God (1 John 4:1).

There should be a desire on the part of all of us to study diligently God's word in search of the truth (2 Timothy 2:15). Understand this, that in our search for the truth, we will ultimately be faced with the decision to obey or disobey that truth. Obey it and be made free. Disobey it or disregard it and one day stand at the judgment bar of God condemned eternally —Charles Hicks
